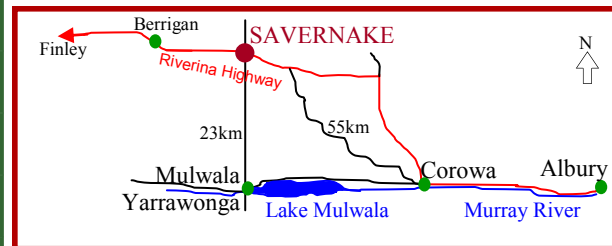

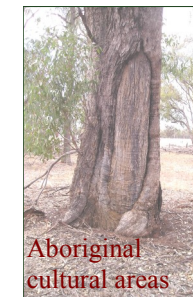

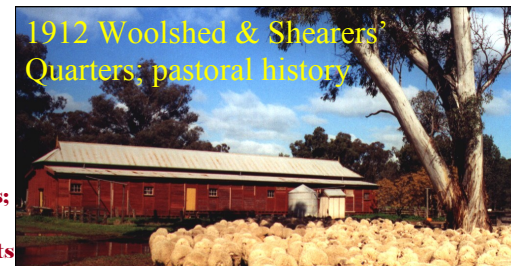

400 hectares of exceptional box-pine woodland. Long species lists. Scientific research sites. 400-year old native pines. Threatened species habitat. Bush tucker.



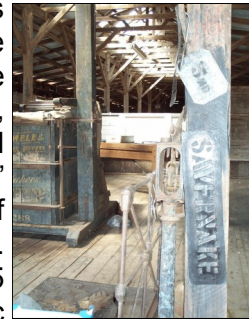
1912 Overseer's Cottage (Farmstay)

Built from local pine, the beautiful interior panelling is a feature of this cosy Cottage. 1 double b/r; 2 twin b/r in period style. Comfortable lounge/room (wood fire/air con); fully equipped kitchen. Enclosed sunroom; patio.



1912 Woolshed, Shearers' Quarters

The Shed, bore & outbuildings are the focus of Station life. We have re-created parts of the woolshed area in 1930's style, while enabling it to retain its full working capacity. The "Store" Museum houses a variety of artifacts & bottle collection. 1895 steam engine, 1935 diesel motor & 1953 electric motor. 1930's Shearer's Bedroom. The Woolroom houses a display about the wool industry, historical weather data and district history. 1862 & 1912 sharpening stones. DVD screenings. DVDs, Books & Souvenirs at discount prices. Light refreshments.



1876 Selector's Hut (wattle & daub) 1880s Boundary Rider's Hut Agricultural Implements

The oldest surviving structures, with authentic displays depicting early European settlement, rugged pioneer lifestyle, historic documents & agriculture. Our most remarkable and untouched historic sites.

Aboriginal Sites & Boat Rock

Canoe Scar Trees, creekline, two midden villages & artifacts.
Boat Rock Hill: A focus of Pangerang aboriginal culture; 2m deep waterhole. Corroborree ground, ochres, scar trees, bush-tucker.



Threatened Species sites & habitat

Superb Parrots frequent the forest summer - winter. Curlews have electrified breeding site. Powerful owls. Gliders. Orchids.



Native Seed Production; Landcare

Vegetation enhancements assist our cropping and prime lamb production. Addition of understorey to flight corridors. Local provenance seed production. Protection of vulnerable areas, rare species, ephemeral creekline.
